## General Superintendent Dr. Scott Daniels



Dr. T. Scott Daniels was elected general superintendent in the Church of the Nazarene at the 30th General Assembly held in Indianapolis, Indiana, USA, in June 2023. At the time of his election, he was serving as senior pastor at Nampa College Church of the Nazarene in Nampa, Idaho.

Born in Detroit, Michigan, USA, Scott was ordained in 1992 by Dr. Raymond Hurn. After being an associate pastor in Washington, California, and Oklahoma, he served as senior pastor for three Churches of the Nazarene: Richardson (Richardson, Texas), Pasadena First (Pasadena, California), and Nampa College. Scott also served on theology faculties at Southern Nazarene and Northwest Nazarene Universities and served as the Dean of the School of Theology and Seminary at Azusa Pacific University.

Dr. Daniels received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Northwest Nazarene University in 1988 and a Master of Divinity degree from Fuller Theological Seminary in 1992. He earned a PhD in Theology and Ethics from Fuller Theological Seminary in 2000.

Scott's ministry has bridged the gap between the church and the academy, often teaching and pastoring simultaneously. In addition to his faculty positions at SNU, NNU, and APU, Scott has taught for Nazarene Theological Seminary, Trevecca Nazarene University, Africa Nazarene University, and Fuller Theological Seminary. This background proved useful during his lengthy service on the Nazarene Publishing Board and as a long-term member and chair of the Covenant of Christian Conduct Committee. He served as the chair of the Christian Action Committee at four General Assemblies.

Dr. Daniels has published numerous articles and book chapters, and delivered several academic papers and presentations. He has authored six books including *Embracing Exile: Living Faithfully as God's Unique People in the World*; *The First 100 Days: A Pastor's Guide*; and *Seven Deadly Spirits: The Message of Revelation's Letters for Today's Church*. His preaching is widely respected throughout the church, making him a sought-after speaker and frequent homiletics teacher and advisor. He has created and maintained a successful podcast – New Creation Conversations – building bridges between the local church and the Christian academy.

Dr. Daniels and his wife, Debbie, live in Nampa, Idaho. They have four adult children—Caleb, Noah, Jonah, and Sophia—all of whom are married. They also have one grandson, Frankie that was born in February.

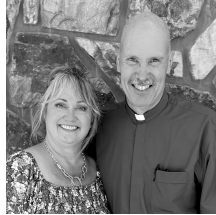

### Report No. 3

We, your Nominating Committee, submit the following nominations and recommendations based on Manual paragraphs 205.23, 301.1—1.3 and 812.X.Section 2; and the guidelines from our General Church leadership, regarding **the election of delegates for the 2027 General Assembly and General Nazarene Discipleship International Convention:**

Specifically, Manual paragraph 205.23 provides the outline for the election of **General Assembly delegates and alternates**. These procedures should be followed by all Phase 3 districts:

1. The District Assembly Nominating Committee shall submit a nominating ballot to the district assembly containing at least six times the number of eligible delegates from the district, ministerial and lay.
2. From the nominating ballot, the number of names will be reduced to no more than three times the number of delegates to be elected.
3. The electing ballot will be by plurality and will determine delegates and alternates according to the order of their election based on number of votes received.
4. The district assembly may authorize the district advisory board to elect additional alternates, if necessary.

As a phase three district with 6,001-10,000 members, we are allowed six total delegates to the General Assembly. Three are to be ministerial: two ordained ministers and the District Superintendent. Three are to be laypersons. In accordance with the above procedure, the Nominating Committee submits the following ballot consisting of eighteen ministerial nominations for the two ministerial delegates and twenty-one lay nominations for the three lay delegates.

The Nominating Committee further recommends that the **Southern California District Resolutions Committee** shall be composed of the elected General Assembly delegates and alternates and have power to act on resolutions submitted from this district.

They are District Superintendent Shawn Siegfried, District NDI President Joy Straub, and the District Children's Ministries Director Emily Holland. We are allowed five additional delegates (two ministers and three laypersons). These delegates are to be active in Discipleship Ministries. A single ballot containing the names of three times the number of delegates needed is offered (six ministers and nine laypersons). Delegates will be elected by a plurality vote. In the order of votes received, alternates equal to two times the number of delegates will be named.

## District Advisory Board Report 2026

The District Advisory Board (DAB) of the Southern California District has met six times via Zoom or in person throughout the 2024-2025 assembly year. Between meetings the DAB conducted business via email. The DAB gave special care to the many responsibilities assigned to the Advisory Board under the provision of the 2023 *Manual of the Church of the Nazarene*, paragraphs 224-228. All board actions have been properly recorded and are on file at the district office in Temecula, CA.

The actions of the board this year included:

1. On Wednesday, June 18, 2025, the DAB:
  - Chose PLNU as the academic institution to house and provide the new Course of Study program.
  - Began the process of drafting a resolution that would prohibit NTS from receiving World Evangelism Funding if/when they employ and/or provide a platform for professors who believe and teach doctrine contrary to that of the Church of the Nazarene.
2. On Wednesday, September 17, 2025, the DAB:
  - Adopted a resolution to the General Board and BGS that would prohibit NTS from receiving World Evangelism Funding if/when NTS employs and/or provides a platform for professors who believe and teach doctrine contrary to that of the Church of the

Nazarene. The Resolution was submitted to the General Board, the General Secretary, and the BGS.

- Allocated \$5,000.00 to Norman Moore Ministries for expenses incurred serving District projects and ministries.
  - Allocated \$3,000.00 to District Man Camp to be used for scholarships.
3. On Wednesday, November 19, 2025, the DAB:
    - Allocated \$7,500.00 for NYC scholarships.
    - Allocated up to \$20,000.00 for Banning roof repairs.
    - Approved the appointment of Shane Prince to serve as a locally licensed pastor at San Bernardino First.
    - Approved the appointment of Lucinda McKenzie to pastor San Bernardino Cornerstone.
  4. On Thursday, December 11, 2025, via email, the DAB:
    - Approved the usage of the San Bernardino First parsonage for the home of lay pastor Shane Prince.
  5. On Monday, December 15, 2025, via email, the DAB:
    - Allocated \$13,000.00 to replace the AC unit at Spring Valley, given that the District receives funds through leasing the Spring Valley facilities.
  6. On Wednesday, January 21, 2026, the DAB:
    - Approved maintaining a minimum balance in the District checking account due to the cash flow demands of District expenses such as camps, retreats, mission trips, etc.
    - Allocated \$2,000.00 for repairs at Palm Springs due to vandalism.
    - Approved allowing Spring Valley to receive the \$3,000.00 rental income that comes from leasing their small chapel. Previously the District was receiving this income.
    - Allocated \$3,000.00 for the repair of the fence at the Colton house property and to also raise the rent of that property by 10%.
    - Designated Twentynine Palms a PAC of Yucca Valley and approved the appointment of Robert Valezuela to serve as pastor.
  7. On Monday, March 9, 2026, via email, the DAB:
    - Allocated \$4,050.00 for electrical repairs to the Spring Valley fellowship hall.
  8. On Wednesday, March 18, 2026, the DAB:
    - Recognized the need to either lease the Palm Springs property or to sell it. By consensus Assistant D.S. Wink Davis was authorized to explore these options.
  9. On Thursday, April 2, 2026, via email, the DAB:
    - Recommended that Highland Community Cross prioritize safety, even if that meant meeting in an alternative location, due to the condition of their bell tower.

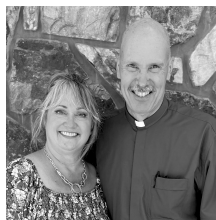

## Plan of Examination

### INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

#### Eligibility

The District Ministerial Board (DMB) serves only students who are properly enrolled in the Course of Study. Enrollment is open to local ministers; local lay ministers (Manual 408.1, Sourcebook for Ministerial Development [SMD]); and deacons who qualify according to Manual 402.

#### Courses

The DMB oversees the preparation of both elder and deacon candidates as well as lay ministry certificates. Ministers will not be ordained without having completed their respective courses. The COS records (educational records) are to be kept on the district where the licensed minister is actively serving (438.6). Once a candidate graduates, the ordaining district will hold and preserve the COS records in their archives.

#### Modes of Study

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is by attending a

Nazarene liberal arts college or university and, if possible, the Nazarene Theological Seminary in Kansas City, Missouri. Other approved modes are the Nazarene Bible College Online, District Training Centers in Alliance with Nazarene Bible College, Northwest Nazarene University Online Directed Studies Program, and the Modular Course of Studies provided by the general church. The modular course of studies is under the immediate supervision of the DMB and requires written approval from the district superintendent.

The Southern California District mandates that several of the required classes be taken through Southern California District Training Center provided classes. These classes include Exploring Nazarene Church History and Polity, Exploring Christian Ministry, Becoming A Holy People, Exploring John Wesley's Theology, and Investigating Christian Theology I and II. To register for these classes, see the District website. Students enrolled at a Nazarene University can use their equivalent college courses to fulfill this requirement.

If a student applies for directed studies, it is preferred that the student will take advantage of the Modular Course of Studies offered online by Nazarene Bible College's Ministry Preparation Program or Northwest Nazarene University's Online Course of Study. In certain circumstances, and with written approval by the district superintendent, a student may do directed studies under the tutelage of an approved mentor.

Except for level one (local ministers), ministerial preparation programs are subject to written permission of the DMB.

The courses required of the college/university students are listed in Manual 424.3. The competency statements for ministerial education are listed in Manual 424.3 and the SMD 437.33. All college/university/district programs must meet these competency statements.

The course listing for the Directed Studies Program is found in the SMD 439.37. But note: One must go online to [www.usacandaregion.org/clergy-education](http://www.usacandaregion.org/clergy-education) for the most up-to-date information. Major changes were instituted as of the 2005 General Assembly.

### **Regulations for the Directed Studies Program**

1. Each candidate is instructed to download a Sourcebook for Ministerial Development (SMD), in order to become familiar with the details of the entire program.
2. Directed study courses have all been re-written and are now available online from Clergy Development via [www.usacandaregion.org/clergy-education](http://www.usacandaregion.org/clergy-education). Please note that all students using the self-study modules require: (1) written approval by the district superintendent approving the use of the self-study plan, and (2) that a mentor meet with the student regularly as the student works their way through the course.
3. Candidates should plan to meet the District Ministerial Board each year before district assembly. Dates for these meetings will be given in advance to the local churches.

### **College Students**

All college students should contact the chair or dean of the religion department at the Nazarene College or University they are attending for guidance in meeting Manual requirements for the ministry.

## CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS (CEUS)

The Church of the Nazarene expects all ministers to be involved in life-long learning as a part of ministry responsibilities.

**Manual 424.6.** *Once a minister has fulfilled the expectations of the educational foundations for ministry he or she will continue a pattern of lifelong learning to enhance the ministry to which God has called him or her. A minimum expectation is 20 contact hours each year (2 accredited continuing education units [CEU's]) or the equivalent determined by the region/language group and stated in their Sourcebook for Ministerial Development. All assigned ordained ministers shall report on their progress in a program of lifelong learning as part of their report to the district assembly. An up-to-date report on his or her lifelong learning program will be used in the pastoral review process and in the process of calling a pastor. The Sourcebook for Ministerial Development for the region/language group will contain the details of the accrediting and reporting process. At least 20 contact hours or its equivalent is recommended annually (115, 121, 413.25, 433.15).*

The District BOM will work closely with the district superintendent in promoting and providing for continuing education credit courses (438.36) for ordained elders and deacons.

## **Nazarene Missions International Report 2026**

Our theme was “Unafraid” which was based off of the Scripture from the book of 1 John 4:18, “Perfect Love drives out all fear.” We challenged the local churches and the leadership to serve God and others, “unafraid” in perfect love. In order to encourage this endeavor, we focused our NMI events on reaching out beyond our walls into the lives of lost and broken people. To elaborate, we held a Family service day at Yucca Valley in order to paint and make their local church ready to reach out into their community. Also, instead of a Promise Fest, we invited our Global Mission director, Jim Ritchie to come teach us strategic ways to open our heart’s door to the communities in which we live. Overall, we accomplished what we set out to accomplish and we did it in the following the 5 areas of NMI:

Alabaster: We sent out Alabaster videos and had Alabaster man present at our NMI Training event with Jim Ritchie to remind everyone to hold an Alabaster offering and to inspire us with the reasons why we participate in this offering. Important links and information were passed out to many pastors and NMI presidents to help connect the local church with this beautiful love offering. We held Alabaster offerings across our District in September and February totaling \$21, 055.48 for the church year. While we are thrilled with this giving, and we are overwhelmed with joy that 22 churches participated, we hope to see every local church participate in this beautiful offering through the 2026-2027 church year. So, where did the money go? The following projects took place because you gave,

### **Key Uses of Alabaster Funds in 2025:**

- **Global Construction Projects:** Funds were allocated across all six global regions to build and buy property for ministry purposes.
- **Renovations & Expansion:** Specific projects included renovating buildings to serve as community centers and expanding church buildings for greater community impact.
- **Missionary Housing & Support:** Funds provided homes for missionaries and supported buildings on Bible college campuses.
- **Direct Support:** Projects are funded in a mix of local contributions and global support, with 100% of the funds going directly to projects.

### **Key 2025 Projects & Facts:**

- **Trinity Church (Scotland):** Supported renovations of a church center set for completion in 2025, allowing for improved community services like hosting, and offering facilities to vulnerable people, and healing addictions

Over 2.8 million dollars were raised, including the giving from our Socal District Churches of

the Nazarene, in order to complete these key projects. Money from 2024-2025 was used for these endeavors, including help given to over 300 NMTs around the world. Our 2025-2026 offerings will combine with the rest of the global Alabaster fund to help projects as soon as this summer. Thank you for giving to the Lord!

**Equipping the Missions' call:** This year we used the NMI training event to advertise Kid's Kaleidoscope and we included it in our handouts at the 2025 NMI convention! This Missions curriculum is being used across Socal to help engage the kids to learn about what the Nazarene church is doing to reach the lost. We handed out links to the free curriculum in PDF at the NMI training event in November and then trained others in how to teach it in Spanish and in English at the Fresh Connections event in February! Praise God! We are reaching kids and teaching them more than ever before that they too can be called to serve in mission in the Church of the Nazarene. A big shout out to Pastor Josue Murillo of Riverside Arlington and to our NYI District president for helping us coordinate and carry out a mission trip to Faithway fellowship during the Fresh Connections event. Thank you to Joy Straub for allowing us to engage the youth at the NDI event and for buying our teens lunch. We thank you Uriel, for showing the teens, our youth, how to serve others in mission. As a result, we have some youth joining us on our District trip to Alaska this year, led by our NMT District director, Pastor Josue Murillo. We thank God for your leadership Pastor Murillo. Another way we engaged the children was at our Family Service Day that was held at Yucca Valley. A huge shoutout to Pastor Emily Holland for helping us coordinate this event to help our kids to have the opportunity to serve.



We were able to paint different areas of this Nazarene church, making it ready for outreach and other types of ministry. All ages are welcome to come serve to experience what mission is all about from the Local church level. Not everyone can go to Africa or Alaska at a young age to serve God's global church, but everyone can join with a local church to help them do God's work.

Finally, we circulated the Global Mission week of prayer in March. All ages had access to prayer booklets in any language; we even had prayer booklets available that were especially designed for the children. We hope to see more churches utilizing these free resources with the children in their churches to engage them in mission. A big thank you to all the NMI presidents that passed these out and to the children's leaders that used them. Below is a snapshot of the wonderful work our teens did at Faithway Fellowship in February.



**Care and Connection:** This year we had the Lopez/Martinez family as our LINKS, Care and Connection missionaries. Diego and Palmira are serving in Spain as Globally deployed missionaries. Diego and Palmira have been entrusted to lead the Wester Mediterranean Field which oversees the strategy for the church in Spain, France, Portugal, Greece, and Malta. In addition to this role, Diego is the district superintendent for the Spanish district. We will continue to connect with them in 2026 till we are assigned a new family in January.

The District Board of Church Properties exists to give service and direction to the local Church relative to the purchase, sale, leasing, and property management of real estate, or the building of churches and parsonages. The policy of this Board is to evaluate each local situation so as to be able to determine the need and the financial activity of the Church involved.

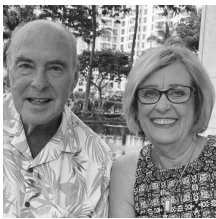
The building plans, financial plans, and/or leases or sale of property are carefully considered. It is our Board policy to limit total indebtedness of the Church to three times its annual income. In cases where the Church is unable to meet its District Educational and World Mission allocations, it is assumed that the Church would be unable to finance a building program, or service a larger debt.

The Board has carefully considered all matters that have come to it during the year and has acted in each case, in line with its stated policy under the direction of our District Superintendent Shawn Siegfried.

We have given guidance and direction to the following Churches and ministries in the past Church Year:

Chula Vista - Sale of Property  
Bloomington - Lease of Property  
Carlsbad - Lease of Property

## Finance and Pastoral Care Report 2026

The District Advisory Board is charged with the general oversight of the financial policies of the district, with special emphasis on the budgeting process, and with providing guidelines and recommendations regarding pastoral care and compensation. The guidelines by which we operate have been established by the District Assembly. We recommend that this Finance and Pastoral Care report, as adopted by the District Assembly, be reviewed by each local church board at the first regular board meeting following the District Assembly.

### Recommendations for Fiscal Year 2026-27

#### I. Concerning the Allocation of Budgets

This has been a good year for District income. God has richly blessed the District this year.

More churches have given more in allocation payments. Because of this, we recognize the principle of shared ministry through denominational budgets, making it possible to more effectively promote the gospel of full salvation around the world. Accordingly, we recommend that the following principles be the basis for the allocation of budgets:

1. To provide channels through which every church participates in the Great Commission through giving to denominational budgets.
2. A church's allocated budgets should be proportionate to its financial strength.
3. To encourage newer and growing churches in their participation as this will develop strong financial and storehouse giving traditions in these churches.
4. To recognize the family-hood of churches on the district by providing help in times of special 266. To conduct a periodic review of the budgeting process in applying the above principles. need to those churches struggling.
5. To recognize our responsibility in giving to others by accepting our fair share in denominational budgets.

In accordance with the recommendations adopted by the General Board, we recommend:

1. That the base for calculation of all budgets be amount raised for all purposes, for which a tax deductible receipt is allowed, minus money sent for the World Evangelism Fund and approved 10% specials.
2. That the following percentage of the budget base be used in calculating the respective budgets for all churches on the Southern California District:
  - a. District Ministry 5.0%
  - b. World Evangelism Fund 5.5%
  - c. NBUSA 2.0%
  - d. Education (PLNU) 2.5%\*

\* This percentage was established by the General Board.
3. That all churches pay their allocation budgets on a regular basis throughout the year rather than awaiting the end of the year.
4. That all churches use the following method of calculation and payment:
  - a. Report church income at [www.fundingthemission.org](http://www.fundingthemission.org). This website will then perform the calculations of respective allocations.
  - b. World Evangelism Fund and Pensions should be paid through the Funding the Mission website.
  - c. District Ministry + Education are calculated on the Funding the Mission website but they CANNOT be paid through that website. District Ministry + Education are calculated on the Funding the Mission website but they CANNOT be paid through that website. There are two methods for payment. 1. Pay the allocations at <https://www.elxiogiving.com/app/giving/socalnaz>. 2. Send these payments to the District Office. The District Treasurer will disperse the Education funds to Point Loma Nazarene University. The District Office mailing address is:

II. Concerning the District Ministry Budget, We recommend:

1. The Proposed District Budget We recommend that the District Budget from the 2024-25 church year be continued.
2. That the District Unified Budget be allocated as follows:
  - a. District Operation \$450,000.00
  - b. Home Mission Fund \$10,000.00
  - c. NMI Ministries \$20,000.00
  - d. NYI Ministries \$10,000.00
  - e. NDI Ministries \$10,000.00

f. General Assembly Reserves \$15,000.00

### III. Concerning the Local Churches

We recommend:

1. All allocations (WEF NBUSA, PLNU, District) should be paid monthly. Local churches should not consider the practice of accumulating allocations towards the making of lump sum payments at the end of the year.
2. World Evangelism Fund budget be funded through Faith Promise giving.
3. World Evangelism Fund and Nazarene Benefits USA Budget be sent directly to Global Treasury Services, through the electronic fund transfer at [www.fundingthemission.org](http://www.fundingthemission.org).
4. The District and Education Allocation be sent to the District Office, either online or via mail.
5. Local churches are encouraged to give toward Nazarene Approved Mission Projects (formerly called 10% Specials).
6. We encourage churches to utilize the Church of the Nazarene Foundation to facilitate planned and deferred gifts from their members to any Nazarene ministry, including gifts to the local church, and to use the Foundation to manage investment accounts, endowments, or charitable trusts ([www.NazareneFoundation.org](http://www.NazareneFoundation.org) or call 913-577-2983). As an alternative, churches could also utilize the resource of Point Loma Nazarene University's Planned Giving Department ([www.pointloma.edu/plannedgiving](http://www.pointloma.edu/plannedgiving) or call 619-849-2302). The District is utilizing the Nazarene Foundation for our investments, and we are very pleased with the service and return.
7. That no church may lease out any of its facilities without the written approval of the District Properties Board, District Advisory Board, and the District Superintendent. After approval, a church may pay expenses directly related to the cost of leasing the facilities out of the money received.
8. W That each church ensure their pastor is enrolled in a 403b account through NBUSA, and that each church encourage appropriate contributions through payroll deductions and matching (payroll addition) contributions.

### IV. Concerning the Auxiliaries

We recommend: That each auxiliary department (NMI, NYI, NDI, camps and retreats) prepares and submits to the DAB by January 31st each year, a proposed budget for the following fiscal year. These will be incorporated into the overall District budget for approval by the DAB in the early March meeting.

### V. Concerning Point Loma Nazarene University

We recommend:

1. That local churches find a variety of ways to support Point Loma Nazarene University through the sending our young people, prayer and paying the District Unified Budget, a portion of which goes to support the University.
2. That the District continue to give full support to the PLNU grant-in-aid program for Nazarene young people from our district as follows:
  - a. General Grant - That an amount of \$2,800 shall be allocated from the District Educational Budget for each eligible, full-time, undergraduate Nazarene student attending PLNU.
  - b. Matching Grant - That we encourage our local churches to participate in the PLNU Matching Grant program, in which the church contributes up to a maximum of \$250 per student per year, and the university, in turn, matches the amount, for a total of \$500.

### VI. Concerning Pastoral Care and Compensation

Below are the items we recommend a church should provide when considering salary packages for pastors and associates:

1. Annual salary review considering cost-of-living and merit increases.
2. Provide full housing reimbursement including utilities, or a parsonage.
3. Reimburse social security costs (including Medicare).
4. Reimburse ministry-related automobile expenses and depreciation.
5. Provide health insurance, medical/dental reimbursement and deductible expenses.
6. File paperwork for NBUSA benefits.
7. Provide a TSA (tax sheltered annuity) equal to 10% of salary and housing.
8. Opportunities for continuing education. 28
9. Reimburse ministerial expenses.
10. Two weeks paid vacation (increasing at the five, ten, and fifteen year mark).
11. Provide a sabbatical every seven years (minimum 7 consecutive weeks).
12. Provide for disability income and/or disability income insurance.
13. Each church needs to develop a set policy on sick leave for pastors if long-term disability occurs. Disability income insurance also is a protection for the church.
14. Provide life insurance (\$50,000).
